## Pathway Options Years 10-14 (KS4/KS5)

Pupils in KS4 and Sixth Form can choose Horticulture as a Pathway. This qualification will introduce aspects of land-based study through various outings, but will mainly focus on Horticulture in practical sessions within the school. Pupils will gain practical gardening skills and knowledge of health and safety in the workplace, grow vegetables, herbs, and fruits from seed in our garden, and learn about progression opportunities should they want to specialise in a specific area.

The courses we offer are:

- Gateway E3/L1 Award in Vocational Studies
- Gateway L1 Certificate in Vocational Studies
- Gateway L1 Extended Certificate in Vocational Studies

## Pathway Options KS4 (Year 10-11) -EL3-L1 Award

Introduction to theoretical and practical concepts of Horticulture.

Development of sector knowledge through community and educational visits e.g., Loughborough Community Farm visit, Kew Gardens.

## Pathways Options KS5 (Year 12-14)- L1 Certificate/Extended
